Overview

Prior to joining Sher Edling, Miranda served as a Legal Research Assistant at the Superior Court of San Francisco. While in law school, she earned a certificate in environmental law and participated in numerous extracurriculars, including serving on the board of a student-run nonprofit that raised substantial funds for unpaid, public interest student internships.
